
Cotoran: Weed Management Recommendations for Cotton

Best Management Practices

- Start fields clean by using residual herbicides
- The key to successful chemical weed control is timely applications
- Alternate between different herbicide groups to avoid resistance issues
- Adding a PSII inhibiting herbicide like Cotoran® in burndown or preplant appllications can help control Palmer amaranth*
- Do not apply Cotoran after first bloom

Preemerge Options*

- Consider using 1 pint of Brake and 1.5 pints of Cotoran
- Another option is to combine Cotoran and Caparol
- A third option would be to pair Cotoran with a Group 15 herbicide like Warrant® or Dual Magnum®

Post As Directed

- Use higher rates when applying postemergence to weeds 2" high or less and cotton is at least 3" tall**
- Use of Cotoran with an approved surfactant may enhance postemergence herbicide activity
